Church Family,

This past Sunday morning, we looked at Acts 1:1-14. Jesus commanded the disciples to stay in Jerusalem and wait on the Holy Spirit who had been promised. After the disciples saw Jesus ascend to heaven in a cloud, they waited in Jerusalem as Jesus told them. They no longer had Jesus physically with them to give them wise counsel on beginning this new phase of ministry. They needed to be divinely empowered to accomplish the task of "making disciples of all nations." As we prepare our hearts for revival this Sunday, I want to challenge us to pray as those early followers of Christ prayed. Here are 3 challenges for us in prayer that I want to remind us of from the sermon this past Sunday.

3 Challenges

- Find a Place—In the case of the disciples and the ladies gathered in Jerusalem, they went to the "upper room."I have heard of people praying in their closets or their bathrooms. Some people love praying outside or on long walks. We all need to find a place that fits us, where we can retreat to in prayer.
- 2. Find a Time—The passage in Acts also tells us about how they spent their time while they waited. Part of verse 14 says, they "were continually devoting themselves to prayer." We need to center our time around seeking Him. Those earliest believers were continually petitioning God to move. Out of our obedience to God and our desire to see Him move, we continually walk with Him in prayer.
- 3. <u>Find a Purpose</u>—The earliest believers were continually praying "with one mind." They had one mission and one focus on their hearts as they prayed. They were not sidetracked by other issues but only focused on praying for the Holy Spirit to come down. Renewal and revival are the focuses of this revival. Pray that revival would take place in our hearts and in our community.


