William's Notes

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth (John 4:23-24).

We may not realize it now, but this announcement by Jesus was revolutionary to the disciples and the early Christians. Even though in Old Testament times we find multiple examples of people worship in the Spirit, it is not the norm. Jewish worship up to this point was almost exclusively about following the rules. Jewish worshipers generally mixed Bible with tradition all tied to the temple in Jerusalem. Even when they were unable to travel to Jerusalem, they would make every effort to face that direction when practicing their ceremonies. With two sentences, Jesus changes all of that. He was sending the Holy Spirit to dwell in the hearts of man.

This is all exceptionally good news for us. We no longer need to dress in a certain way, go to a certain place, practice certain traditions, or follow any ritualistic practices to worship. Through the blood of Jesus, the power of the Holy Spirit and the truth of Scripture, we can now worship any time and any place freely. What a blessing. We can sing, clap, play loudly and confidently on musical instruments, or softly and reverently as the Holy Spirit leads any time any place. Then it gets even better when we come together under the authority of Scripture. What better time of the year to worship in the Spirit than Thanksgiving. I hope to see our Sanctuary filled with true worshipers on Sunday when we count our blessings together.
